Alzheimer's Disease is the most common type of dementia in the United States. Approximately five million people in the U.S. have the disease and the numbers are expected to double by the year 2050. Although the main feature of Alzheimer's disease is a gradual onset of memory problems, other problems related to language, personality, judgment and visual spatial skills may also be exhibited. This presentation will assist in identifying the early warning signs of the disease and discuss how the disease progresses, analyze alternative options for management of the disease, explore care plan development and examine the effectiveness of the treatment/care plan. The Alzheimer's continuum will be explored, as well, along with the signs and symptoms likely to arise during each of the stages.
